Course Outline:

In this intermediate class students continue to develop their drawing skills through the study of increasingly challenging set-ups and more advanced subject matter. Participants will learn how to handle tricky drawing problems such as drapery, organic objects, and reflective surfaces. We will also cover effective strategies for drawing the human figure and portraits. This course is designed to increase the student's confidence, and give her or him the knowledge to take on any drawing challenge. **OBJECTIVE:** This class is for those who have mastered the basics and are ready to really test their drawing skills. A great class designed to give students the confidence to take on complex subject matter such as reflective surfaces, glass, drapery, and the human figure.

Course Materials:

For the first class bring a pencil, an eraser, and something to draw on. We'll discuss the rest of the materials then.

Such as : Sketchbook Paper Dry media (pencil, charcoal, conté) Wet media (ink, pens, brushes)
kneaded eraser
